Dear friends

I hope this finds you and your family well. Things have moved so very fast. I'm thinking back to the first Sunday of Lent, 1st March, when we explored faith around the theme of seeds being sown. I put out a challenge of giving something up (like having a chocolate egg then and there but not eating it until Easter Day). I asked us to think about taking something on in faith – to give time and attention perhaps to some way of serving others. I mentioned that it could be thought of as a time to spring clean (and maybe to clear out?). And I talked about being ready to relocate, just as Jesus took himself off to the desert, and as there is something to be said for taking time to retreat.

We did not appreciate then the significance of what was already happening in China and in Italy, and now affects people all around the world. Now, whether we like it or not, we have all had to give things up. Opportunities for serving others, especially for those who are young and fit, are there in plenty; and even just phoning one another is a service we can all do. And we will have more time for cleaning than we would wish, and more time for thinking on our own.

My prayer is that despite the undoubted hardships of this time, and the very real worries, and though some if not many may be tested to the limit, we shall with God's help come through this. "Lent" in English speaks of the lengthening of days. It will be a long time, but as Jesus said, "tomorrow will worry about itself" (Matthew 6:34). Live each day well. Be blessed, even through the time of trial.

The Month of April

Our reading of Matthew's Gospel comes to a climax now as we come to Easter. If you have been keeping up with readings, by the end of March we reached the end of chapter 22. The weekly chunks remaining are as follows:

March 30th – April 5th Matthew chapters 23-25. The events of Jesus' last week are kicking in. What is this kingdom of heaven? What does it take us away from and what does it take us towards? And what do we do for now?

April $6^{th} - 12^{th}$ Matthew chapters 26-28. Told slowly and carefully, these are the climactic moments in Jesus' story. We go with Jesus to the place called Golgotha; and then with his followers we go to the place where his body was laid; and then at the very end we go to Galilee, where his active ministry had first begun.

And then? Some of you have told me that you have welcomed this opportunity to read in advance the texts which Sunday services draw upon. Now, I'm not the best forward planner to put it mildly (!), but let's be decisive, and determine to read some key passages from the other Gospels in these first weeks after Easter. Therefore:

For Sunday 19th April, advance reading would be John 20. 19-31

For Sunday 26th April, advance reading would be Luke 24. 13-35


For Sunday 3rd May, advance reading would be John 10. 1-17
