A Message from Rev Dr Peter Donald

Dear friends,



Our summer this year feels as if it's come in two distinct modes — one of almost continuous sunshine and warmth, the other of almost continuous rain. It's not quite the case but to hear of what all is going on around the world in terms of climate, I daresay we can be thankful for what we have had. I keep in touch with a pastor in India. The rains there have been horrendous, much worse than usual. And as those who have been into southern Europe know, or indeed across in the USA, it has not been at all normal the extremes of heat which have been experienced day after day.

With children in our Holiday Club, it so happens we chose to go on a "Cosmic Quest". To hear of (day 1) the Lord who created the heavens and the earth, of (day 2) the Lord who is sovereign over the winds and the waves, of (day 3) Jesus whose power of healing and resurrection defied all norms, and of (day 4) the loving Father who runs out to embrace the lost son who comes home. Stories for children accompanied by action songs and messy challenges and games and altogether a fun week – for the adults too! But stories not just for children. It matters for us all to think about (1) who are we on this planet Earth. And I've been preaching a week or three on the book of Proverbs, which in a very long introduction emphasises and emphasises again, are we going to look for wisdom or are we going to be distracted and drawn away from it? Are we interested in being wise, or are we content to be fools? Wisdom attaches to God. God with us, there's a thought. How wise was Jesus! He was wise even through and beyond his crucifixion – because sin is not to be given into. We cannot be complacent about our failures.


Boys' Brigade
