Dear friends,

Brigid and I were very grateful recently to have some help in cutting things back in the Manse garden. Some of the bushes certainly needed it badly, and there are trees needing attention as and when that's possible. I'm not a great gardener but I do know that you cut back in order to foster new growth, and for the sake of shaping and managing.

It is quite a positive way to think of cutting back. There is a season for it. So might that help us as a picture for the season which is undoubtedly on the way for the churches across all of our area?

Well, it needs to be handled with care. In the garden uncontrolled cutting back could kill the bush altogether; you want to know what you're doing while you are pruning, and what the best time for it is. So in the church story that's the point which we are at. There will be fewer Ministers around, and there should be fewer buildings around. But how we do it, for the sake of new growth?

At the end of September the Presbytery had presented to it a draft Plan. It contained definite proposals – including quite radical cuts in the Calderbank and Chapelhall directions. That was painful to discover, but it wasn't helped by the lack of supporting explanation. There wasn't a strong case made for why this should be the Plan. Up to now, our own local cluster talks had anticipated definitely pruning in the Calderbank and Chapelhall directions, but we had not closed the discussions. In fact we positively wanted to work at our options. So I did speak up at Presbytery and discovered, as I imagined, that we were not the only cluster group who were struggling to understand the reasoning behind the specifics of the Plan. I moved that the Presbytery Planning Group should explain their thinking and solicit reactions from Kirk Sessions before the whole Presbytery were obliged to vote. And this passed.

The result is that the draft Plan is therefore still out for consultation, and we hope we will both hear a bit more of why the Planning Group made their proposals and how we might best respond to them.

Please continue to keep this in your prayers. And always feel free to talk / ask / dream about what is best.


#### **Christmas Fayre**

teas and cakes.



And tell the trick or treaters What Gods' love is all about!


