#### A Message from Rev Dr Peter Donald

#### Dear friends

Over in Ayrshire I saw a billboard advertising a "Holy Fair". I didn't get the detail but I know as a historian these were a thing in days past, and perhaps with all the Robert Burns associations in Ayrshire, that's where the notion came from. It translated historically into the Glasgow Fair and so on — a holiday period. For holiday as a word came from "holy day", recalling the tradition that when the church marked special days, people would enjoy time off work.

All this history, but now I suggest we think of "holy days" as any day. And I mean by that, allow each day to be holy because it is the gift of God, and God offers Himself to come close to us. Through the Old Testament that only happened around the worship place and with priests doing their bit; but since Jesus came, and ever since, we should have a sense that ordinary days matter alongside the Sabbath. The best of relationships grow around the dinner table, or in the kitchen, or out for a walk. So it is with you and I relating to God. And church is you and I regularly touching base with "the wider family".

As we have faith, we have been called to live lives open to the blessing of God. God has spoken so as to shape who we are and to open our eyes to God's purpose to bring all things together under Jesus Christ (Ephesians 1:10). And since we have been reached out to and touched by the grace of God (the power at work for our salvation – Romans 1:16), I hope that you like me can rejoice that He gives us direction for our living. Our days can be "holy", in that every day we rise from our sleep, the first good Word to us is "I will be with you".

He will be with us in work and in leisure, in times of rejoicing and in times of sadness. He has known us from within the womb. In His arms we die. And one day we shall see Him face to face.

And for now, let's hope we can enjoy some summer days!

#### **Presbytery Planning**

The Presbytery met in June, which was just the second time since it re-formed into this much larger body called "Forth Valley and Clydesdale". We were informed that planning meetings are running behind time, but more information will be released at the end of the summer, and a series of Presbytery meetings will then take place to make decisions in October into early November. The challenging issue is how to allocate ministries in the foreseeable future, since the current set-up has too many congregational charges for the number of Ministers available. And then there is also a drive to rationalise the Church's building stock across the country, which is anticipated to mean closures and disposals of buildings.


The Kirk Session sent in its initial reports as required. We continue to await the next stages.

#### **HELP FOR UKRAINIAN REFUGEES**

Church of Scotland congregations and individuals have donated £397,535.65 so far to help support the humanitarian response co-ordinated by Reformed Churches in Hungary and Ukraine.

In a letter of thanks to the Church of Scotland, the Presidium of the Reformed Church in Transcarpathia wrote: "Dear Brothers and Sisters in the Lord Jesus Christ "In recent times, many organisations, churches and individuals, both known and unknown, have lent a helping hand to our church here in Transcarpathia.

"Our congregation and our institutions have offered shelter for hundreds of refugees (internally displaced persons) whom we could not have cared and provided for on our own.

"Thank you for your compassion - expressed through your generous donations — with the refugees who might never have experienced the providence and love of God if they had not been put in this situation.

"Many have witnessed their faith among us and many have understood and embraced the authenticity of love they experienced.
