Dear friends

I confess I was very moved on Easter Day when we opened the church doors, appreciated the new heating installation, and joined with a strong



company of fellow worshippers. The organ sounded great, and how special it was for those who could manage to be with one another.

Social distancing has been so testing and it continues alas to place constraints on how we operate, especially indoors, but we are aware of how the pandemic continues to rage in parts of the world. 

TAX RELIEF ON DONATIONS MADE TO CALDERBANK CHURCH VIA GIFT AID



As you may know Calderbank Church is a registered charity and under the Gift Aid scheme can claim tax relief on all donations made to the Church. This has the effect of raising the value of the donation. For example, for every £1 you

give using Gift Aid, at the current basic rate of tax that gift is worth £1.25. Only taxpayers are eligible to claim gift aid. One declaration covers all gifts to a charity. So, **if you are a taxpayer** and have not already signed a declaration, could I ask you please to sign one now and return it to the Church. This will cover any gifts you make to the Church in the future. Unfortunately, we cannot claim tax relief Contributions received from donors who had not signed a declaration. A gift aid declaration form is included with this newsletter and copies are available at the Church door. A copy can also be downloaded from https://assets.publishing.service.gov.uk/government/uploads/system/uploads/attachment_data/file/468016/Charity_GAD_Multiple_Donations.pdf. Please hand a signed declaration to a church elder, drop at the Church, post or email to news@calderbankchurch.co.uk.

Our aim is to ensure that everyone is aware of this scheme so that we can maximise the benefit for the work of the Church. To all contributors we offer sincere thanks for your generous support without which the Church could not carry on its good works. 101 ways to start a conversation with God



'Chat and catch' is simply the way we describe prayer. Just like we chat with our friends, and catch their answer - whether they tell you in words, a gesture or just by their body language - so we can chat and catch with God. Not just about the big things, but the little things too - we know that God wants to hear everything that's on our hearts (Philippians 4:6), and that he promises to talk to us too (Jeremiah 33:3).

Sometimes, it's helpful to have some ideas of things to help you start chatting and catching with God, so here are 101 ideas to get you started. Conversation is best when it's two-way! So remind your kids to catch if God is saying anything back and then carry on the conversation. Think of these ideas as conversation starters rather than stand alone ideas.

Remember it doesn't really matter what you chat about. The idea is just to keep encouraging your kids to connect with God and weave it into any and every part of their day. Feel free to use these reminders however you like. You could print them off and cut them out and pick one at random to try as you eat breakfast. Or you could stick one on your kid's mirror, or let them choose one for you to do in the car or just work through the list from top to bottom! Use them however works best for you and your family.
